# CTDA President's Report *by Neil Newitt*

## Train passenger service

The announcement of the reintroduction of the passenger train service to Clunes should be welcomed, not just as a benefit to commuters, but as an opportunity to grow and strengthen the wider community through business development.

In making the announcement, Premier John Brumby spoke of the people living and working in Clunes using the train service to commute for work, study or leisure.

"It will ensure that Clunes people can access job, education and leisure opportunities in Ballarat and Melbourne".

But In addition to the benefit to commuters, opportunities will develop for businesses servicing those who will use the stop.

For example, Clunes has no taxi service but there may be a need for one to service the train. Opportunities also arise for the accommodation providers in Clunes to package their stays for visitors using the train service. Of course, the timetables and schedules have yet to be finalised.

The announcement was made as part of the \$630 million plan by Regional Development Victoria to develop opportunity and prosperity in regional Victoria. The Clunes train stop is seen as a part of this plan.

As Brumby stated, "This investment is an investment in the future of Clunes".

The Premier has already spoken of Clunes' future. Back in January during his Australia Day speech, Brumby stated: "The regional community of Clunes in north-west Victoria sees its future as a cultural destination centered around

literature". So Clunes is well positioned to be a part of regional development in Victoria.

The Clunes village video produced by Tourism Victoria and the Clunes Tourist and Development Association is almost completed and will be valuable in promoting the town. Along with the continued strength of new events such as Back to Booktown, and established events (the Clunes Show) it is encouraging to see the recognition and focus Clunes is currently enjoying.

# Clunes is now on Track

## Great News for the Top of Town

The Premier's welcome announcement of the return of the return of regular passenger train services to Clunes has dominated recent events and comes just four weeks after our meeting with the Minister for Public Transport, and days after the presentation in Parliament of the two petitions that have been circulating in the town.

As well as returning the train to Clunes, the Premier announced the allocation of \$7 million for the restoration of our railway station. This is arguably the biggest single investment in Clunes since the introduction of the sewage scheme and will result in the restoration of another of our historic buildings. However, in the larger picture it is not just to benefit Clunes. The expenditure should be seen as the Government investing to ensure the success of three of its initiatives, the Ballarat-Maryborough rail link, the Goldfield's tourism strategy, and the regional growth corridor that extends from Ballarat to Mildura.

I wish to publicly acknowledge the support of the Clunes community, the efforts of the train committee and pay tribute to Federal Member for Ballarat, Catherine King Greens representative Colleen Hartland, and a very special one to my colleague and vice president Richard Gilbert. A special thanks to the ladies and management of the Top Shop for their wonderful work promoting the petition. I also acknowledge the efforts of Noel and Lin Foster, who for many years have devoted their time and efforts to maintaining the grass around the railway station, preserving the appearance of a main entrance to the town. A word of thanks is also due to Bill McClenagahn and Don Henderson, the two members of Hepburn Council that supported us at the start of the campaign.

The work of TRAC is not over, we will continue our efforts to improve public transport in Clunes. Clunes station will be serving not only the local community but will be a gateway for tourism to this historic town. We will be approaching the Council with the aim of establishing a community bus service between the town and the rail station coinciding with the train timetable.

Work has commenced upon an interpretive display celebrating the history of the Ballart Maryborough rail service.

The committee has already received a number of suggestions for facilities and attractions that could be a feature of the station. This is a matter needing full community discussion and input and we invite you to provide us with your ideas. We will be initiating a full community consultation process and we will be in liason with the Government about the results.

## Founders & Survivors

'Founders & Survivors will be the topic of a presentation by Historian and author Professor Janet MCCalman from Melbourne University who will speak at the Daylesford Museum, 100 Vincent St, on Friday 2nd July at 8pm.

This is an exciting project which will follow the lives of nearly 73,000 convicts transported to Tasmania; along with five generations of their descendants. It is expected to become one of the world's great historical studies of immigration, forced labour and settlement.

The project, involving universities across Australia, the United Kingdom and Canada, together with family historians and the descendants themselves, seeks to discover what happened to these convicts transported between 1803 and 1852. How many were able to make a new start? How many founded families? How many became not just survivors but founders? It will follow mothers and daughters, fathers and sons, looking at life span, health, families, occupations and where they settled.

The Australian convict records, and in particular those from Tasmania, are the most detailed and intimate records of men and women from anywhere in the world during the nineteenth century. Their world heritage status has been recognised in the UNESCO Memory of the World.

If you are interested in learning more about this project or becoming involved then the Daylesford and District Historical Society encourages you to come along to its July meeting.
