G'day everyone, it's been a while; I hope every one is now back into the swing of work/school etc, firstly the Crime round up....

It's been a big couple of months, January and February have been very busy. There were 7 reported incidents, being four residential burglaries, 2 incidents of Criminal damage, a burglary on a business premises, 3 reported fires and a partridge in a pear tree.

The good news is that I have charged an offender with burglary and theft from the Clunes Neighbourhood House in which he has stolen a couple of laptop computers and the criminal damage of a window at the Top Shop. He is due to appear in the Ballarat Magistrates Court on 21st Feb, 2011 to face these charges as well as a long list of other charges relating to burglaries, thefts, damages and other criminal behaviour that has occurred in Clunes over the past 4 or so months. I don't expect to see him back here in Clunes for quite a while...

As most of you are aware I was away on leave during the January floods, I have spoken to a number of locals who were battling the flood waters and they spoke of the community spirit and co-operation that was displayed during this difficult time. I had reports that there were even young primary school aged kids helping out at the sand bagging station. It just goes to show you why we all love living in a small community.

Now that school has gone back, please be aware of the little ones riding their bikes to and from school. Also I have been asked by the primary school to remind everyone of the 40 km/h zone and school crossing that operates in the school precinct every school morning and afternoon, please take care in the area.

**If you need police attendance for an emergency situation ALWAYS ring 000.**

**PS:** Jason GARDINER was sentenced at the Ballarat Magistrates Court on 21/2/2011 for 14 charges including a number of burglaries, thefts and damages to a total of 6 months imprisonment, 3 months of which was suspended for 12 months and upon release he will be entered into a Community Based Order for 12 months. In essence he has to serve 3 months in prison and upon release has to be of good behaviour for a period of 12 months. If he is convicted of an offence within that 12 month period he will have to serve the remaining 3 months imprisonment plus whatever sentence he receives for any other offences.

Although the sentence sounds light, it is in fact a good outcome. I was in court and heard Mr COUZENS comments and rest assured if GARDINER re offends he will be dealt with severely. Magistrates COUZENS made extended comments as to GARDINER's behaviour impacting greatly on the community of Clunes.

## Creek Clean-Up

Those who have visited the creek in the last few days will have noticed a huge change. Unwanted trees and the mass of debris have been removed leaving a clear and unobstructed waterway. The work has been the result of the seventy thousand dollar funding from State Government, part of a total package awarded to Creswick and Clunes in response to the recent floods in both towns.

With the possibility of further heavy rainfalls onto water soaked ground there is no guarantee that this work will prevent further flooding. Hepburn Shire has recently formed a citizens' flood action group and it's first meetings have been held in Creswick. The Clunes Waterway Management has attended their meetings with other

members of the Clunes community. The Council and all other State authorities are being lobbied to ensure that all factors contributing to the flooding are addressed, one of these being the inadequate drainage in Creswick and Clunes. Bruce Hill has undertaken a detailed study throughout our town and his report will be presented to the Council for urgent action. Subsequent meetings will be rotated between Clunes and Creswick.

The clean-up work on our section of the creek has extended to the lower sections of the banks revealing the remaining historic bluestone. The waterway group will be making the cleaning of this stone work a feature of its working bees. There is still some confusion regarding our work! We are not about to perform any type of replanting within the waterway, as apart of the DSE we are only permitted to perform works on the top of the banks. At the moment this is limited to weeding and the planting of native grasses to help protect the banks. This is labour-intensive work and we welcome all the help we can get... so why not join one of our regular working parties.

## Mens Shed gets underway

Good news for those who expressed interest in Clunes having its own Mens Shed workshop. We have now received the first instalment of the Government funding awarded last year, the shed building has been ordered and should in place ready for use by the end of March. We have our first order... a request to manufacture book shelves for Creative Clunes.

Also thanks to the generosity of Ann and Peter Bulard we have received our first donation of equipment.

A meeting of all interested people will be called very soon to get the organization formally established. Further good news is the receipt of funding for a very innovative project for the garden area of the site. The result of a successful application to Hepburn Shire under its sustainability grants initiative. Members of the Clunes Neighbourhood House were presented with a substantial \$3,500 at a formal presentation held in Daylesford last Wednesday. Expect to see a lot of activity at the community area in Alliance Street everyone is welcome to call in either to watch or, hopefully, get involved.

## A NEW Clunes Market

Big changes are being made to Clunes Market. Established for over twenty years time has now come to inject new life into market Sunday in Clunes. Poor public support has meant that there has been little incentive for stallholders to come to our town and we have had the chicken-and-egg situation where without customers we can’t get stalls and without stalls we can’t attract customers.

However each month many hundreds of market customers flock into the Goldfields area from Bendigo and Ballarat the week after the Clunes Market. Many hundreds pass by Clunes on their way to Talbot. Therefore as from March the Clunes Market is changing from the second Sunday to the third Sunday to attract to those passing customers into our town. The move is also sensible as it will strengthen our position in the Goldfields Tourism campaign helping to bring an increase in prosperity to the regional corridor from Ballarat to Maryborough that was established with the reintroduction of the passenger rail service.

In keeping with the Goldfields Marketing theme ‘Villages of the Goldfields’ the Clunes Market has been renamed The Clunes Village Market to be held in a closed section of the main street It is in the interests of all Clunes business and organizations to support the Clunes Village Market by organizing special promotions and events to attract visitors to the Golfields on the third Sunday of each month.

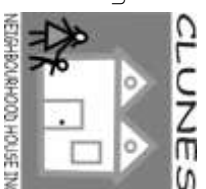
